GENERAL INFORMATION



I. INTRODUCTION

The World Wushu Championships (WWC) is the highest level of international competition within the sport of wushu. This biennial event began in 1991 and always captures the excitement and range of wushu both in the explosive full-contact combat sanda bouts and the dynamic movements and distinct weaponry of taolu forms competition. While the number of participating athletes and member federations has grown substantially as wushu has continued to expand across the globe, the purpose of WWC has at its core, remained the same: to be the comprehensive pinnacle of wushu competition.

The dynamism of the HYX 16th World Wushu Championships (HYX 16th WWC) in Fort Worth, Texas in the United States of America will befit the significance of the event. From November 14th through the 20th, 2023, senior athletes from over 80 countries/ regions are expected to compete in Fort Worth at the zenith of competitive wushu for the first time since the pandemic. The United States of America Wushu Kungfu Federation (USAWKF) is responsible for organizing the HYX 16th WWC under the auspices of the IWUF. The 40th IWUF Executive Board Meeting and 16th IWUF Congress will be held on November 15th and 16th, respectively, in conjunction with the HYX 16th WWC.

B. The United States of America



The United States of America is a large country in North America, often referred to as "the USA", "the U.S.", "the United States", "the United States of America", "the States", or simply "America". Home to the world's third-largest population, with over 331 million people, it includes both densely populated cities with sprawling suburbs and vast, uninhabited natural areas.

With its history of mass immigration dating from the 17th century, it is a "melting pot" of cultures from around the world and plays a dominant role in the world's cultural landscape. It's home to a wide array of popular tourist destinations, ranging from the skyscrapers of Manhattan and Chicago to the natural wonders of Yellowstone and Alaska, to the warm, sunny beaches of Florida and Hawaii and the deserts of Arizona.



C. Fort Worth, Texas

Fort Worth is the 12th-largest city in the United States, known for Texas hospitality and a dozen remarkable districts full of culture and fun. Fort Worth is in the Prairies and Lakes region of Texas. With a population of over 900,000, it is Texas' 5th largest city. It is part of the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex, which has a population exceeding 7 million.

Sometimes referred to as Cowtown, it is by far closer to its cowboy roots than neighboring Dallas.







D. International Airport

Dallas Fort Worth International Airport (IATA: DFW, ICAO: KDFW, FAA LID: DFW) is the main airport serving Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex area in Texas, United States. The distance to Fort Worth is 24 miles (38 km).

Dallas Fort Worth Airport is the third busiest airport worldwide and in 2021, Dallas Fort Worth Airport registered 62,465,756 passengers.



E. Weather

Historical average temperatures for Fort Worth in November range from 47°-70°F (8°-21°C).

V. VENUE

A. Competition Venue

The Fort Worth Convention Center is a convention center and indoor arena located in downtown Fort Worth, Texas. The Fort Worth Convention Center Arena is located across the street from the event's official hotel. The complex opened on September 30, 1968, and was expanded in 1983, 2002 and 2003.

The Fort Worth Convention Center exhibit area is 21,145.9 m². There will be four Fields of Play in the Arena. The Fort Worth Convention Center Arena is located across the street from the event's official hotel There will also be designated Taolu and Sanda warming up areas within the Convention Center.

VII. QUALIFICATIONS

A. Membership

Only those federations/associations which have paid their IWUF annual membership fees for 2022 and 2023 will be permitted to participate in the 16th HYX WWC.

New IWUF member federations may be invited to take part in the HYX 16th WWC after their membership applications have been accepted by the IWUF.

B. Nationality

Athletes must have citizenship of the same nationality as the country/territory which they are representing.

Athletes who have dual citizenship can only represent one (1) country / territory in the championships.

C. Age Requirements

Taolu athletes 12 years old and older, i.e. born after January 1, 2011, may participate.

Sanda athletes between 18-40 years old, i.e. born between January 1, 1983 and December 31, 2005, may participate.



VIII. PARTICIPATION METHODS

A. Team Composition

Each member federation can enter at most one (1) team, hereinafter is referred to as "Team".

Each Team can comprise of both taolu and sanda members.

Each Team shall comprise of a maximum total of twenty-four (24) members, with up to twelve (12) members designated each for taolu and sanda as follows:

- One (1) Team leader
- Two (2) Team coaches
- One (1) Team doctor
- Eight (8) athletes (including men & women)

Each athlete may enter a maximum four (4) of the following taolu events:

- One (1) bare hand routine: Changquan, Taijiquan, Nanquan
- One (1) short weapon routine: Daoshu, Jianshu, Nandao, Taijijian
- One (1) long weapon routine: Gunshu, Qiangshu, Nangun
- One (1) choreographed sparring routine

Each Team may enter at most one (1) Duilian event total

Each Team may enter at most one (1) male athlete and one (1) female athlete into the Creative & Nandu Skills Demonstration Event



VIII. PARTICIPATION METHODS

C. Sanda Events

Each Team shall be composed of a maximum of eight (8) sanda athletes, with at most five (5) men and at most three (3) women athletes.

Each Team may enter at most one (1) athlete per weight category, and each athlete may enter only one (1) weight category.

Unless otherwise stated within these regulations, the competition will be conducted in accordance with the:

- IWUF Wushu Taolu Competition Rules & Judging Methods (Excerpt) 2019
- IWUF Wushu Sanda Competition Rules & Judging Methods (2017)

Hereinafter, competition rules for both taolu and sanda disciplines will be referred to simply as the "Rules" and "Methods" in each context.

The Rules and Methods may be interpreted solely at the discretion of the IWUF.

In the event of language discrepancies in the Rules and Methods, the English text shall prevail.



A. Taolu Competition

i. Optional Routines

Men's Changquan and Women's Changquan events are scheduled to have preliminary and final rounds. In both rounds of competition, the athletes can use either the same routine or change it for the final round. More regulations on this are to come.

The "Events with Degree of Difficulty Scoring Method & Standards" will be implemented.

Within a single routine, an athlete may register and perform a single Degree of Difficulty Jumping Technique at most two (2) times; however, the Degree of Difficulty Connection for these jumps may not be repeated (e.g. within a single optional routine an athlete may register and perform xuanfengjiao 360° (360° Tornado Kick) at most two (2) times, but the Degree of Difficulty Connection for each Tornado Kick must be different).

All athletes are required to execute their optional routine's relevant compulsory/mandatory techniques, and failure to do so will result in deductions as stipulated in the Rules.

A. Taolu Competition

ii. Taijiquan and Taijijian

Accompanying music is required for Taijiquan and Taijijian routines and must be uploaded through the online registration system with each Team's final entry submission. Music with vocals and/or lyrics is not permitted.

iii. Duilian Routines

For Duilian (choreographed sparring) routines "Events without Degree of Difficulty Scoring Method & Standards" will be implemented.



B. Sanda Competition

The competition will utilize the single-knockout method. However, if the number of athletes in a given weight class is three (3), a round-robin competition method will be adopted.

Following arrival and accreditation, sanda athletes will undergo an initial weigh-in and drawing-of-lots as stipulated in the schedule and continue with daily weigh-in on the morning of each day they have a bout per the IWUF Wushu Sanda Competition Rules & Judging Method (2017).

X. UNIFORMS & EQUIPMENT

The following sections list uniform and equipment requirements and procedures for different locations and functions.

A. Competition Requirements

i. Taolu

Each athlete shall wear wushu competition uniforms that conform to the requirements as stipulated in the Rules during all events. All athletes must provide their own uniform(s).

All weaponry must conform to the requirements as stipulated in the Rules. All athletes must provide their own weaponry.

Two (2) competition bibs (20cm*15cm) for each athlete's use will be provided by the Organizing Committee to Teams upon accreditation. All taolu athletes must have their competition bibs attached to the back of their clothing before entering the competition arena.

ii. Sanda

Each athlete must provide two (2) sets of competition uniforms: one (1) blue set and one (1) red set.

Each athlete must provide their own mouth guard, jockstrap, and instep guard. Gloves and protective equipment manufactured by IWUF's certified supplier(s) will be provided by the Organizing Committee.

X. UNIFORMS & EQUIPMENT

B. Compliance Requirement of Marketing and Advertising

All Teams must follow the IWUF Brand Control Guidelines for Wushu Competition Uniforms (excerpt) (see Appendix 1).

C. Clothing Requirements for Opening/Closing Ceremonies

All Teams must wear their official national/territorial team uniforms at the Opening and Closing Ceremonies.

D. Clothing Requirements for Awards Ceremony

Medalists are expected to attend the Awards Ceremony in their national/territorial team uniforms; however, they are permitted to attend the ceremony wearing competition uniforms should the ceremony take place immediately after the competition.

Athletes are expected to take off caps/hats during the ceremony.

Athletes and officials are not allowed to take any religious symbols to or onto the podium.

X. UNIFORMS & EQUIPMENT

E. Compliance Check at Roll Call Center

Uniform and weapons checks will be conducted at the Roll Call Center in accordance with stated regulations and requirements. Uniforms and weapons checks are conducted by the Chief Register and the Rollcall Officials as stipulated in the Rules. Non-compliance may be subject to disqualification from the competition.

All athletes are required to attend the initial roll call thirty (30) minutes prior to the start of their competition event and be present for all subsequent roll calls. Failure to be present for three (3) roll calls will result in forfeit.

Note: The Creative & Nandu Skills Demonstration Event is a non-medal demonstration event, and 1st-3rd place winners will receive certificates.

XI. PLACING & AWARDS

B. Awards Ceremony

Athletes having won a medal are required to attend the Awards Ceremony to receive their medals in person. In case a medalist is unable to attend the ceremony for a valid reason, his/her medal may be presented to an official of the relevant delegation.

Absence without a valid reason will forfeit the right to receive a medal.

Team leaders, coaches, doctors, observers, and members must stay at the designated area and are prohibited from entering the awarding platform area and/or interrupting the Awards Ceremony.

If fewer than three (3) athletes participate in a given event, no Awards Ceremony will be held for that event, however, athletes will still be ranked and receive awards accordingly.

Athletes having won a medal are advised to observe and follow the IWUF Awards Ceremony Procedure (Appendix 2).

The awards ceremony will take place during competitions, and the awarding place will be informed in due course.



XI. PLACING & AWARDS

C. Participation Certificates

All members of each Team, including team leaders, coaches, doctors, and athletes will receive a HYX 16th WWC participation certificate.

The Team leader is required to collect the participation certificates, as well as certificates of taolu athletes placing 4th-8th (if applicable), for their Team from the Organizing Committee at the designated Results & Certificate Center.

XII. REGISTRATION

A. Preliminary Entry

The Preliminary Entry Form (Appendix 3) must state the number of athletes as accurately as possible taking part in the events so that the LOC may prepare the organization of the event accordingly. The Preliminary Entry Form and formal request for an American visa invitation letter must reach the IWUF Secretariat by email (events@iwuf.org) no later than 24:00 (Central Standard Time) August 1, 2023.

B. Final Entry

All final entries must be submitted through the IWUF Online Registration System www.iwuf.org/registration.

The deadline for final entry submission through the online system is 24:00 (Central Standard Time) on **September 29, 2023**. Each Team is required to print a copy of the submitted entry and present it during accreditation upon arrival in Fort Worth.

All sections of the online entry must be completed in full, including registration of athletes' Degree of Difficulty Techniques in the relevant online section.

XII. REGISTRATION

All payments due to the LOC must be paid in full for registration to be considered complete. For information on judge registration, see Section XVII.A.ii.

i. Post-deadline Entries or Changes

After the final entry deadline, any information change (including late entry) will be handled as follows:

- Late entries are subject to the approval of the IWUF and, if accepted, are subject to a late-entry fee of US\$ 100 per athlete.
- Replacing athletes is subject to approval of the IWUF and, if accepted, is subject to a replacement fee of US\$ 100 per athlete.
- Changes due to incorrect or missing registration information are subject to the approval of the IWUF and, if accepted, are subject to a change fee of US\$ 100.
- The above fees must be paid in cash to the IWUF Secretariat before the Opening Ceremony.

XIII. ARRIVAL & ACCREDITATION

A. Arrival

All Teams are required to register with the HYX 16th WWC Organizing Committee at the designated Accreditation Center no later than 24:00 (Central Standard Time) on Tuesday, November 15, 2023

All judges are required to register with the HYX 16th WWC Organizing Committee at the designated Accreditation Center no later than 24:00 (Central Standard Time) on Monday, November 13, 2023

Hotel check-in is after 15:00 (Central Standard Time), and accommodations should be booked accordingly (e.g. Teams wishing to check in before 15:00 must have booked their accommodations for the previous day as well).



XIII. ARRIVAL & ACCREDITATION

B. Accreditation

Accreditation Center(s) will open at 09:00 on November 13, 2023. Upon arrival at the Accreditation Center, the Team leader is required to complete the following process with the Organizing Committee:

Accreditation cards will be given to the team leader upon completion of the accreditation process. Accreditation cards must be worn during all official HYX 16th WWC events.

The training schedule will be announced after accreditation has concluded.

XV. DRAWING OF LOTS

The Drawing of Lots will be conducted by the scheduling-recording group supervised by the Jury of appeals and the Chief Referee on November 16, 2023. The Drawing of Lots for taolu and sanda disciplines will be held simultaneously in two separate rooms. Each Team should send one to two (1-2) representatives for each discipline to attend the sessions.

The Jury of appeals will draw lots on behalf of Teams if the Team representatives are absent from the session.

XVI. WEIGH-IN

The first official weigh-in for all sanda athletes will take place at 07:00 on November 16th, 2023.

Afterwards, sanda athletes must attend a weigh-in on each day they participate in competition (specific time and places for each weigh-in will be announced accordingly). Accreditation cards and passports must be presented at each weigh-in session. A sanda athlete's failure to attend any required weigh-in will result in his/her disqualification from the competition.



XVII. TECHNICAL OFFICIALS & JURY OF APPEALS

A. Judges (Referees)

i. Appointment of judges

Each Team may submit at most one (1) taolu judge and one (1) sanda judge to officiate at the WWC. All judges of the HYX 16th WWC must hold a valid IWUF International Judge License at the time of competition.

The IWUF will appoint independent judges at its discretion to serve at the HYX 16th WWC.

Judges must have participated in one of the 2023 IWUF International Judges Training and Certification Courses and passed the respective examination in order to qualify to judge at the HYX 16th WWC.

All International Judges must input their valid IWUF certificate numbers through the online registration system when registering and present their original certificates to the IWUF Judges' Committee upon arrival and registration in Fort Worth.

XVII. TECHNICAL OFFICIALS & JURY OF APPEALS

ii. Registration

Information for judges selected by teams must be submitted at the time of team registration.

iii. Judges' Refresher Course

All HYX 16th WWC judges are required to participate in the Judges' Refresher Course. The purpose of this course is to ensure that judges have a solid understanding and grasp of competition rules, and to enhance transparency, objectivity and quality in judging.

iv. Judges' Uniform Requirements

The Organizing Committee will provide judges with ties for men and scarves for women during the competition. All judges shall prepare their own black jackets, white dress shirts, black slacks, and black leather shoes.

B. Jury of appeals and appeals procedures

The Jury of Appeals and appeals procedures shall be subject to the relevant provisions of IWUF Wushu Taolu Competition Rules & Judging Methods (Excerpt) 2019 and IWUF Wushu Sanda Competition Rules & Judging Methods (2017).

XVIII. SUPERVISORY COMMISSION

A HYX 16th WWC Supervisory Commission shall be established by the IWUF, with the purpose of and the right to resolve any disputes or investigate any issues that arise during the course of the HYX 16th WWC to ensure the smooth execution of the event.

The Supervisory Commission for an IWUF World Championships consists of three to five (3-5) members appointed by the President of the IWUF and is responsible for overseeing Championships management and dispute mediation for the entire duration of the Championships and not beyond. Specific descriptions of responsibilities include:

- The Commission will ensure that Championships adhere to principles of fair play, impartiality, and transparency.
- The Commission represents the IWUF in handling disputes regarding the Championships that arise between NFs and/or teams and/or the LOC and has the right to resolve such disputes. However, the Commission does not directly interfere with the competition proceedings or disputes arise within the competition, which are responsibility of Jury of Appeals and relevant judging panel.
- The Commission represents the IWUF in coordinating between NFs and/or teams and/or the LOC.
- The Commission shall report any irregularities or violations observed during the Championships to the IWUF President and the IWUF Executive Board.
- The Commission shall monitor and demand that NFs take responsibility for their athletes' general attitude and comportment.

XIX. ACCOMMODATION

A. Accommodation Reservation

XXII. PASSPORTS & VISA REQUIREMENTS

All HYX 16th WWC participants must hold a valid passport and should allow plenty of time for visa application and processing. To ensure as few complications during visa application and travel as possible, it is suggested that all participants' passports are valid for at least six months following their final day of travel.

Teams that require visa invitation letters should state their requests in the Preliminary Entry Form by 24:00 (Central Standard Time) August 13, 2023. If you need any assistance on visa issues, please contact LOC at registration@wwc16.org.

NOTE: Due to the long waiting time needed for appointments at US Embassies worldwide, we strongly recommend teams that need to apply for visas do so immediately.

XXIII. DOPING CONTROL

Doping control will be conducted during the HYX 16th WWC in accordance with the requirements of the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), and will follow the procedure prescribed in the latest IWUF Anti-Doping Rules. The HOST shall contract with NADOs to execute testing activities on request by ITA.

XXIV. RESPONSIBILITY OF MEMBER FEDERATIONS

NFs are responsible for their officials, coaches, athletes, and observers adhering to the IWUF and WWC principles and to all relevant rules established by the IWUF and the Organizing Committee. NFs should ensure that their participants hold themselves to the highest standards in all their actions during the event.

A. Fundamental Principles

All NFs' Team members participating in the HYX 16th WWC must observe and respect the IWUF constitution, rules, regulations, and representatives. Individuals deemed to have acted against the IWUF, its principles, interests or purpose may be subject to suspension or expulsion from the event and/or cancellation of their accreditation.

B. Attitude of Athletes and Coaches

The athletes will compete under the responsibility of their NFs. NFs are fully responsible regarding the general attitude and comportment of their athletes. Coaches should respect the judging panel and all complaints must be conducted in accordance with competition procedures. Athletes and Coaches should comply with the IWUF Ethic Codes.

C. Image of Athletes

Each NF is responsible for obtaining the rights for the IWUF to use its athletes' images at the discretion of the IWUF for promotional purposes in all forms.

D. Insurance

Each NF is fully and sole responsible for insuring its athletes against injury and third-party risk (public liability) during the period of the HYX 16th WWC. The IWUF and the Organizing Committee are not responsible in part or in whole of the said liability.

XXV.CREATIVE & NANDU SKILLS DEMONSTRATION EVENT

The Creative & Nandu Skills Demonstration Event is a non-medal demonstration event, and 1st-3rd place winners will receive certificates. The purpose of the event is to provide an opportunity for wushu athletes to push the limits of their creativity and display their unique talents, demonstrating the beauty and distinctive visual appeal of wushu.

Specific requirements are as follows:

- The time limit for each competitor is set at thirty (30) seconds.
- Creative & Nandu Skills Demonstration Event choreography must incorporate the characteristics of wushu.
