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I. GENERAL INFORMATION

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Host Country Overview

Bulgaria is located in Eastern Europe, on the Balkan Peninsula, bordering the Black Sea to the east, Romania to the north, Serbia and North Macedonia to the west, and Greece and Turkey to the south. The country covers an area of 111,000 square kilometers and has a population of about 6.5 million people.

With a history spanning over 1,300 years, Bulgaria's origins date back to the emergence of the First Bulgarian Empire in the 7th century (681 year). Throughout the centuries, the region has experienced a series of conquests and shifts in power, including periods of Byzantine and Ottoman rule, each leaving imprints on Bulgaria's cultural identity.

The distinctive Bulgarian folk music, with its unique rhythms and haunting melodies, is an essential part of national identity.

In terms of architecture, Bulgaria showcases a blend of styles, from ancient Thracian and Byzantine structures to the elaborate Orthodox churches and Ottoman mosques. Notable landmarks include the Rila Monastery, an architectural masterpiece and a symbol of Bulgarian cultural history, and the ancient city of Nessebar, a UNESCO World Heritage site known for its well-preserved medieval architecture.

The nation's cuisine reflects a combination of flavors from the Balkans, Mediterranean, and Slavic traditions.

Bulgarian customs and festivals, like the lively Kukeri festival, showcase the country's vibrant cultural tapestry, blending pagan and Christian traditions in a riot of color and folklore.

The Cyrillic alphabet, a script derived from the Glagolitic alphabet, was created in the 9th century by the Byzantine scholars Cyril and Methodius. Primarily designed for the Old Bulgarian Language (Old Church Slavonic language), it evolved into the writing system for various Slavic languages, including Russian, Bulgarian, and Serbian.

Bulgarian language has evolved over the centuries, incorporating influences from various linguistic sources, including Greek, Turkish, and Persian. This amalgamation has resulted in a complex and nuanced language characterized by a rich vocabulary, intricate grammatical structures, and a distinct phonetic system.

Bulgarian language is the official language of Bulgaria, and since 2007 has been among the official languages of the European Union. It is also spoken by the Bulgarian historical communities in North Macedonia, Ukraine, Moldova, Serbia, Romania, Hungary, Albania and Greece.

1.2 Host City Overview

Burgas is the second largest city on the Bulgarian Black Sea Coast in the region of Northern Thrace and the fourth-largest in Bulgaria after Sofia, Plovdiv, and Varna, with a population of 203,000 inhabitants, while 277,922 live in its urban area. It is the capital of Burgas Province and an important industrial, transport, cultural and tourist centre.

There are a historical museum, an ethnographic museum, an archaeological museum, a large port and a beautiful sea garden in the city. Only 35 km from Burgas is located the famous seaside resort of Sunny Beach.

Burgas has a mediterranean climate (Köppen Climate Classification Csa) but with continental influences. The summertime in Burgas lasts about five months from mid-May until late September. Average temperatures during high season (April - October) is 24 ° C (75 ° F). Burgas Time Zone: UTC+2 (EET). Summer (DST): UTC+3 (EEST). Elevation: 30 m (100 ft).

Burgas airport is situated about 11 km north east of the city of Burgas. Both arrival and departure areas are split in Shengen and Non-Shengen zones.

The organizing committee offers free transportation from Burgas Airport to the hotel and back.

1.4 Weather

Burgas is located on the Bulgarian Black Sea coast, which gives its climate a strong maritime influence, although continental elements from inland Bulgaria are also present. According to the Köppen classification, Burgas falls into the Cfa zone, a humid subtropical climate. This means the city experiences warm summers, relatively mild winters compared to the interior of the country, and rainfall spread fairly evenly throughout the year without a pronounced dry season.

The average annual temperature is around 12 to 14 ° C. July is the hottest month, with daytime temperatures often rising above 27 ° C, while January is the coldest month, when nights may drop close to or slightly below freezing. Rainfall is moderate, with precipitation occurring throughout the year, but winter and spring tend to bring more rainy days. The proximity of the sea softens extreme temperatures,

providing a more balanced climate overall.

By late April, spring is already well established in Burgas. Daytime temperatures usually reach around 16 to 18 ° C, making the weather mild and comfortable, though not yet hot. Nights remain cool, often dropping to about 8 to 10 ° C, so evenings and early mornings still require a jacket or warmer clothing.

1.5 Electricity

In Bulgaria, the electricity supply for residential use operates at 230 volts (formerly referred to as 220 volts) with a frequency of 50 hertz, in line with the European standard. The typical household current is single-phase, while three-phase connections are available for industrial and larger commercial consumers. Standard power outlets are of type F (Schuko).

1.6 Telephone

Bulgaria uses the international dialing code +359. When calling within the country, the national trunk prefix is 0 (for example: +359 123456 and 0123456). The city of Burgas has the area code 056 for landline numbers. For example, a call to a Burgas landline from abroad would be dialed as +359 56...

Telephone services in Bulgaria are well developed, with both fixed-line and mobile networks widely available. Mobile coverage is strong in Burgas and throughout the country, with all major operators providing 4G services and ongoing expansion of 5G networks. Internet-based calling and mobile data services are also common, making telecommunication in Burgas reliable and in line with European standards..

2. INTRODUCTION TO WORLD TIJQUAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Hosted by the International Wushu Federation (IWUF), the World Taijiquan Championships (WTJQC) is one of the official events of the IWUF. With the first edition began in 2014, the WTJQC takes place biennially and four editions have been held so far. Features competition focused on taijiquan and its related events for both men and women. The Bulgarian Wushu Federation is responsible for the organization of the 5th WTJQC under the auspices of the IWUF.

In Demonstration Events, if the registered athletes of each age group in a single event is 5 persons or less, these events will be combined with other age categories and/or events.

(The numbers in parentheses indicate the number of movements in the compulsory routines. E.g., Taijiquan (42) means 42 movements in its routine.)

8. AGE CATEGORIES

8.1 Championship Events

9. QUALIFICATIONS

9.1 Membership

- Only those federations/associations which have paid their IWUF annual membership fees for 2025 and 2026 will be permitted to participate in the 5th WTJQC.
- New IWUF member federations may be invited to take part in the 5th WTJQC after their membership applications have been accepted by the IWUF.

Hereinafter the IWUF member federation is referred to as "NF".

9.2 Athlete Eligibility

- Athletes must be **citizens or permanent residents** of the country that they are representing.
- Athletes who have dual citizenship can only represent one country/territory in the championships.
- In cases where athletes have changed their citizenship, such athletes are required to have resided in the country or territory that they are representing for at least two (2) years prior to the opening day of the competition or activity, during which time they may not have represented any other country or territory in any international competition.
- Pursuant to the above, pursuant to the provisions of the Olympic Charter applying subsidiarily, the Technical Committee shall deal with all disputes relating to an athlete's eligibility for participation and report to the IWUF Executive Board for a final decision.

10. PARTICIPATION METHODS

10.1 Quota

- Each NF can enter at most **1 team**.
- Each team shall be composed of a maximum of **30 members**.

10.1.1 Athlete

For Championships Events, each team may, at most, enter **4 male athletes and 4 female athletes**.

For Demonstration Events, each team may, at most enter **8 male athletes and 8 female athletes**.

10.1.2 Team Official

- Each team may, at most, enter **4 team officials** including:
 - 1 team leader
 - 2 coaches
 - 1 doctor

10.1.3 Team Judge

Each team may, at most, enter **2 team judges**.

10.1.4 Observer

Extra team delegate(s) exceeding the quota shall be registered as observer(s).

10.2 Participation Events

- Each team may, at most, enter to participate in **1 Jiti events**. Each group must be composed of **at least 6 athletes**, *athletes can be mixed from championship and demonstration events*, and genders and ages of athletes are not limited.
- Each athlete may, at most, enter to participate in **3 individual events and 1 Jiti event** including:
 - 1/2 bare-hand routines
 - 1/2 weapon routine
 - 1 Jiti routine
- Athletes registered within championship events may only participate in championships events; Athletes registered in demonstration events may only participate in demonstration events.
- Within championship events, Simplified Taijiquan (24) & Simplified Taijijian (32) are limited to the A age group competition only.
- Within demonstration events, Simplified Taijiquan (24) & Simplified Taijijian (32) are limited to the D, E and F age group competition only.

10.3 Relevant Documents

Upon arrival at the Accreditation Desk, team leaders must present the following documents:

- Completed and signed **Waiver of Liabilities** (Annex 1) of all participants, which must be signed by his/her parent or legal guardian for the participant who is under 18 years of age.
- **Medical Certificates** (Annex 2) of all athletes issued by a qualified medical doctor from a check-up performed within a period of **15 days** prior to the registration date of the competition.
- **Life Accidental Injury Insurance Certificates** of all athletes.

11. COMPETITION RULES

Unless otherwise stated within these regulations, the competition will be conducted in accordance with **the IWUF Wushu Taolu Competition Rules and Judging Methods (2024)** (hereinafter referred to as "rules").

The rules may be interpreted solely at the discretion of the IWUF. In the event of language discrepancies in the rules, the English version shall prevail.

12. COMPETITION METHODS

12.1 Group Competition

If the number of registered athletes for a particular routine exceeds 50, athletes of that event will be randomly and evenly divided into **2 or more groups** by the computer for the competition.

No preliminaries and finals will be held for those events.

12.2 Optional Routines

For the optional routines, the "Events with Degree of Difficulty Scoring Methods and Standards" will be implemented. **312B, 323B, 323C, 324B and 324C** must be connected to the connection movements as stipulated in the rules table 10-3-9 when landing.

12.3 Compulsory and Jiti Routines

For the compulsory routines (*including the Elementary Routines, New Standardize Routines, Five Styles Taijiquan Competition Routines, 1st set of the International Wushu Competition Routines and 3rd set of the International Wushu Competition Routines*) and Jiti routines, the "Events without Degree of Difficulty Scoring Methods and Standards" will be implemented.

12.4 Routine Time Limits

12.4.1. Championship Events

- **3rd set of the International Wushu Competition Routines**

- **Five Styles Taijiquan Competition Routines**

- Yang style (40), Chen style (56), Wu style (45), Wu (hao) style (46), and Sun style (73) Taijiquan routines: **From 5 to 6 minutes** in total duration.

- **New Standardized Routines**

- Yang style, Chen style Taijiquan routines : **From 3 to 4 minutes** in total duration
- Yang style, Chen style Taijijian routines: **From 3 to 4 minutes** in total duration

- **Elementary Routines**

- Taijiquan (24) routine: **From 4 to 5 minutes** in total duration (A Group Age Category Only)
- Taijijian (32) routine: **From 3 to 4 minutes** in total duration (A Group Age Category Only)

12.4. Accompanying Music

- Accompanying music is required for:
 - **Optional routines (with Degree of Difficulty):** Taijiquan, Taijijian, and Taijishan
 - **3rd set of the International Wushu Competition Routines:** Taijiquan, Taijijian, and Taijishan
 - Jiti Routines
- Each NF must upload the accompanying music through **the IWUF Online Registration System** with their final entry submission. **NFs shall be responsible for the music copyright used.**
- Accompanying music with vocals and/or lyrics is not permitted.

12.5. Roll-Call

- Athletes shall report to the designated Roll-call Area at:
 - 30 minutes prior to the start of the event (first roll-call)
 - 20 minutes prior to the start of the event (second roll-call)
 - 10 minutes prior to the start of the event (final roll-call)
- Failure to be present for roll-call will result in forfeit.

13. COSTUMES AND EQUIPMENT

13.1 Compliance Requirement of Marketing and Advertising

All teams must follow the IWUF Brand Control Guidelines for Wushu Competition Uniforms (excerpt) (Annex 3).

13.2 Uniforms, Weaponry and Equipment Requirements for Competition

13.2.1 Uniforms and Weaponry

- Athletes shall wear wushu competition costumes and use the competition weaponry in

compliance with the rules during all events.

- All athletes must provide their own uniforms and weaponry.

13.2.2 Competition Bib

- LOC will provide 2 competition bibs (20cm*15cm) to the teams for each athlete's use upon accreditation.
- The athlete should show his/her competition bib to the Head Judge before he/she enters the competition mat.

13.3 Clothing Requirements for Opening and Closing Ceremonies

All teams must wear their official national/territorial team uniforms at the Opening and Closing Ceremonies.

13.4 Clothing Requirements for Awards Ceremony

Medalists are expected to attend the Awards Ceremony in their national/territorial team uniforms.

13.5 Compliance Check at Roll-Call Area

Uniforms and weapons checks will be conducted at the Roll-call Area in accordance with stated regulations and requirements. Uniforms and weapons checks are conducted by the Chief Registrar and the Roll-call Officials as stipulated in the rules. Non-compliance may be subject to disqualification from the competition.

14. PLACING AND AWARDS

For those events of the group competition, the below placing and awarding methods will be conducted in each group.

14.1 Championship Events

- **1st place:** Gold medal and Certificate
- **2nd place:** Silver medal and Certificate
- **3rd place:** Bronze medal and Certificate
- **4th–8th place:** Certificate

14.2 Demonstration Events

- **1st Category Prize:** 10% of the actual number of participants will receive Gold Medal & Certificates.

- **2nd Category Prize:** 20% of the actual number of participants will receive Silver Medal & Certificates.
- **3rd Category Prize:** 30% of the actual number of participants will receive Bronze Medal & Certificates.
- The awarding ratios will be based on **the actual number of participants** in an event and the 0.1 binary method will be implemented.

14.3 Jiti Events

- In general, Jiti events will be placed and awarded as follows:
 - **1st Category Prize:** 10% of the actual number of participants will receive certificates.
 - **2nd Category Prize:** 20% of the actual number of participants will receive certificates.
 - **3rd Category Prize:** 30% of the actual number of participants will receive certificates.
- The awarding ratios will be based on **the actual number of participants** in an event and the 0.1 binary method will be implemented.

14.4 Participation Certificates

All accredited people will receive a 5th WTJQC participation certificate.

Team leader is required to collect the participation certificates, as well as the award certificates of athletes ranked 4th–8th places and 1st–3rd category prizes (if applicable), from the LOC at the Results & Certificate Office.

15. AWARDS CEREMONY

Awards Ceremony will be held for the medalists in Championship Events and Demonstration Events. The awarding area for Demonstration Events will be specially denote for it.

The Awards Ceremony for Championship Events will take place in each competition session.

15.1 Medalists

Medalists must:

- Attend the Awards Ceremony to receive their medals **in person**.
- Be escorted by staff to the Waiting Area **10 minutes** before the Ceremony to prepare accordingly.
- Not bring any national/territorial, cultural, religious symbols or national flags onto the podium.
- Remove caps, hats, and sunglasses throughout the Awards Ceremony.
- Face the flags during they are being raised.

15.2 Athletes and team officials

Athletes and team officials are required to remain in the designated area.

15.3 Special Cases

15.3.1 Medalist Absence

- In case a medalist is unable to attend the ceremony for a valid reason, his/her medal and certificate may be presented to the appointed official of the team.
- Absence without a valid reason will result in forfeiture of the right to receive a medal.

15.3.2 Insufficient Participants

If there are fewer than 3 medalists in a single event, no Award Ceremony will be held for that event. The team leader will receive the medals and certificates at the Results and Certificates Office.

16. ENTRIES

16.1 Preliminary Entry

16.1.1 Open and Close Dates

- ***Open: December 26, 2025***
- ***Close: January 25, 2026, at 23:59***

16.1.2 Requirements for Registration

- All teams must state the number of athletes and team officials as accurately as possible taking part in the events so that the LOC may reserve the hotels and prepare the organization of the event accordingly.
- There is no guarantee for hotel rooms reservation for teams failed to submit their preliminary

entry before the required deadline.

- All teams are required to complete their online preliminary entry before the deadline to access the final entry system.

16.2 Final Entry

16.2.1 Open and Close Dates

- **Open: January 26, 2026**
- **Close: March 1, 2026, at 23:59**

16.2.2 Uploading Documents

- **Photos** of the participants (white background, head filling 70-80% of the photo, at least 480 pixels in width and 600 pixels in height)
- **Passports** of the participants (must be valid for **at least 6 months** following their final day of travel)

16.2.3 Requirements for Registration

- All sections of the online entry must be completed in full.
- All payments due to the LOC must be paid in full for registration to be considered as completed.
- Each team is required to print a copy of the submitted entry and present it to the LOC upon registration.

16.3 Late Entry and Changes Policy

After the final entry deadline, teams must submit a confirmation document with signature via email to events@iwuf.org. Teams shall pay corresponding fees before the late entry and changes deadline, otherwise request will be denied.

16.3.1 Open and Close Dates

- **Open: March 2, 2026**
- **Close: April 1, 2026, at 23:59**

16.3.2 Relevant Fees and Requirements

- Any request to change the entry (including the late entry) will be handled as follows:
 - The late entry is subject to the approval of the IWUF and, if accepted, it will incur a late-entry fee of **USD 100** per participant.

- Replacing a participant is subject to approval by the IWUF and, if accepted, it will incur a replacement fee of **USD 100** per participant.
- If changes are required due to incorrect or missing registration information, those changes are subject to approval by the IWUF and, if accepted, it will incur a fee of **USD 50** per change.

16.4 Registration of Degree of Difficulty and Compulsory Content

Online registration of the athletes' Degree of Difficulty and compulsory content of the optional routines, if applicable, must be submitted through **the IWUF Online Registration System**. The system will:

- **Open on January 26, 2026**
- **Close on April 16, 2026, at 23:59**

17. ARRIVALS AND ACCREDITATION

17.1 Arrivals

The following accredited personnel are required to register with the LOC at the LOC-designated hotels no later than:

- **Team judges: April 23, 2026, at 23:59**
- **Athletes and team officials: April 24, 2026, at 23:59**

17.2 Accreditation

Accreditation Desks will open **on April 23, 2026, at 9:00**.

Upon arrival at the Accreditation Desk, the team leader is required to complete the following process:

1	Present each team members' passports
2	Submit Final Entry Form with signature and stamp and confirm the registration information
3	Submit 3 national flags (size: 1m*2m)
4	Submit national anthem (short version) in MP3 format on a CD or USB flash drive
5	Submit signed Waiver of Liabilities of all participants (Annex 1)

6	Submit valid Medical Certificates (Sample) of all athletes (Annex 2)
7	Submit valid Life Accidental Injury Insurance Certificates of all athletes
8	Pay the relevant participation fees in full (if applicable)
9	Pay the relevant penalty fees in full (if applicable)
10	Submit a bank receipt of payment (either in paper or electronic documents)
11	Confirm each athlete's Registration Form for Degree of Difficulty and Compulsory Content of Optional Routines and sign the form
12	Sign and confirm all the above items are completed

Accreditation cards will be given to the team leader upon completion of the accreditation process. All personnel must participate in the official activities with their accreditation card during the 5th WTJQC.

The competition and training schedules will be distributed after accreditation has concluded.

18. TECHNICAL MEETING

The technical meeting for team managers and coaches will take place **on April 25, 2026, at 10:00**. Each team should send 2 representatives to attend the meeting. The place of the technical meeting will be announced in due course.

The technical meeting content will be presented as follows:

- IWUF Event Guidelines (IWUF representatives)
- Event Logistics Information (LOC representatives)
- Event Technical Details (Chair of Jury of Appeals and Chief Referee)
- Other Matters

19. DRAWING OF LOTS

After the technical meeting, the drawing of lots will be conducted by the scheduler-recorder group supervised by the Jury of Appeals and the Chief Referee on **April 25, 2026**.

Each team may send 2 representatives to attend the session.

The Jury of Appeals will draw on behalf of the teams that are unable to send a representative to attend.

20. TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

20.1 International Technical Officials (ITOs)

- Each team may send at most **2 taolu team judges** to officiate at the 5th WTJQC subject to approval of the IWUF.
- IWUF will select and appoint the independent judges and the Jury of Appeals at its discretion to serve at the 5th WTJQC.
- All team judges and independent judges of the 5th WTJQC must hold their **valid IWUF Judge's License** at the time of the competition.

20.1.1 Registration

- The information for the team judges must be submitted at the time of their team registration.
- The Jury of Appeals and all independent judges appointed by the IWUF shall submit their registration information through **the IWUF Online Registration System**.
- All team judges and independent judges of the 5th WTJQC must input their **valid IWUF Judge's License numbers** through the online registration system.

20.1.2 Uniforms

All ITOs shall prepare their own black jackets, white shirts, black slacks, and black leather shoes, as well as bring the IWUF ties/scarfs.

20.1.3 Judges' Refresher Course

- All 5th WTJQC judges are required to participate in the judges' refresher course.
- Absence without a valid reason will be forfeiture of the right to officiate at the 5th WTJQC.

20.2 National Technical Officials (NTOs)

All NTOs serving at the 5th WTJQC will be nominated by the LOC.

21. SUPERVISORY COMMISSION

The 5th WTJQC Supervisory Commission shall be established by the IWUF, with the purpose of and the right to resolve any disputes or investigate any issues that arise during the course of this competition to ensure the smooth execution of the event.

The Supervisory Commission for an IWUF competition consists of 3–5 members appointed by the President of the IWUF and is responsible for overseeing the competition management and dispute mediation for the entire duration of this competition and not beyond. Specific descriptions of responsibilities include:

- The Commission will ensure that competitions adhere to principles of fair play, impartiality, and transparency.

- The Commission represents the IWUF in handling disputes regarding the competitions that arise between the NFs and/or teams and/or LOC, and has the right to resolve such disputes. However, the Commission does not directly interfere with the competition proceedings or disputes arise within the competition, which are responsibility of the Jury of Appeals and the relevant judging panel.
- The Commission represents the IWUF in coordinating between the NFs and/or teams and/or LOC.
- The Commission shall report any irregularities or violations observed during the competitions to the IWUF President and the IWUF Executive Board.
- The Commission shall monitor and demand that NFs take responsibility for their athletes' general attitude and comportment.

III. TEAM INFORMATION

22. ACCOMMODATION

22.1 Hotel Reservation

All accredited personnel are required to stay at the LOC-designated hotels.

- **Check-in: After 14:00**
- **Check-out: Before 12:00**

NOTES: Teams wishing to:

- Check-in **before 14:00 on April 23, 2026** must book accommodation **from April 22**.
- Check-out **after 12:00 on April 30, 2026** must book accommodation **until May 1**.

22.1.1 Non-Compliance Policy

Teams not staying at the LOC-designated hotels due to special reasons shall pay a participation fee of **EURO 200** per person. In this case:

- Teams are fully responsible for their own accommodation, meals, and transportation.
- LOC is not liable for any consequences arising therefrom.

22.1.2 Reservation Principles

- Hotel reservations are available on a **first-come, first-served** basis.
- Early reservations are **strongly recommended** due to limited availability.

22.1.3 Meal Arrangements

LOC will provide meals for all accredited personnel:

- From the evening of their arrival date to the midday on their departure date
- 3 meals daily (breakfast, lunch, and dinner)

22.1.4 Early Arrival and Late Departure Requirements

Participants wishing to arrive or depart outside the scheduled dates must:

- Submit their intended arrival and departure dates during the final registration process.
- Confirm accommodation bookings accordingly, with daily rates applicable.

22.2 Room Assignment Rules

22.2.1 Teams with Odd Number of Delegates

Teams with an odd number of delegates (including athletes and team officials) when having reserved double rooms, LOC will assign the extra delegate to share a double room with a member from another team, if the individual chooses not to pay for a single room.

22.2.2 Team Judges

Team judges reserving double rooms will be paired with other team judges by the LOC.

22.3 Hotels Information

22.3.1 VIP Hotel

- ***Primoretz Grand hotel and Spa (5-star)***

The distance to Mladost Sports Hall is 9 minutes by car (4.4km).

Grand Hotel & SPA Primoretz is a 5-star luxury hotel, uniquely positioned in Burgas. It is situated in the Sea Garden (Morska gradina), directly on the beach front, with very close access to the city centre.

The hotel offers about 109 rooms and apartments, including standard, deluxe rooms, junior suites, executive suites, a grand apartment, a premier apartment, and a presidential apartment. Many rooms have sea views or views of the city and the Sea Garden.

Guest rooms are well-equipped: a large 2 m × 2 m bed, mini-bar, safe, individually controllable air conditioning, high-speed Internet (WiFi + LAN), cable/satellite TV, analog telephone, bathroom with both bathtub and shower, hairdryer, and many rooms have a balcony or terrace with seating. The decor is a blend of classic and modern luxury.

For dining, Primoretz has multiple restaurant and bar options. There is the main "Primoretz" restaurant (with indoor and terrace seating, often with scenic views), the "Salini" Mediterranean restaurant, a lobby bar, piano-bar, pool bar, and seasonal outdoor dining areas.

The hotel features extensive spa and wellness facilities under the name "6th Sense" — indoor heated pool, outdoor pool (seasonal), children's pool, jacuzzi, sauna, steam room, Hammam/Turkish bath, Vichy shower, sea water salt bath and therapeutic treatments. It also

has a fitness center, massage and beauty salon.

In terms of location, Primoretz enjoys an excellent position: directly on the sea, steps away from the beach, very close to the Sea Garden promenade, with easy walking distance to many city attractions. It is about 14 km from Burgas Airport. Check-in is usually from 15:00, and check-out by 12:00.

23.2 Shuttle Services

24. FINANCIAL CONDITIONS

24.1 Teams

- Any international or domestic airfare and related travel expenses, as well as the participation fees of all participants shall be borne by themselves.
- The participation fees include accommodation, meals, pick-up/drop-off to and from the designated airport, local transportation, entry (excluding the late entry and changes fees) and certificate, etc.

24.2 Technical Officials

- The international airfare, accommodation and meals shall be provided by the LOC for the appointed independent judges and the Jury of Appeals.
- The expenses above for the team judges shall be borne by their teams themselves.

24.3 Additional Costs

Participants arriving early or departing late may be subject to additional costs related thereto which shall be borne by the participants themselves.

24.4 Payment Methods

- All teams are required to complete full payment in advance to the LOC **by 23:59 on April 1, 2026** through international wire transfer. Until complete payment is received, hotel rooms will not be reserved, and accreditation will not be issued.
- Teams that are unable to pay through international remittance due to government policies and restrictions should communicate with the LOC in advance to make arrangements, otherwise accreditation will not be issued.
- All international wire transfer and bank fees are to be paid by the teams transferring the funds themselves.
- Proof of full payment should be sent to the LOC by email and brought along to the LOC by the team leader. LOC requires that all participation fees are to be paid in advance in order to secure accommodation as required by the official hotels. LOC will be unable to guarantee a team's required accommodation without pre-payment in full. Teams are requested to be mindful of this when submitting their final entry.

25. DOPING CONTROL

Doping control will be conducted during the 5th WTJQC according to the requirements of the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), and will follow the procedure prescribed in the IWUF Anti-Doping Rules. The number of tests will be decided by the International Testing Agency (ITA). If an athlete is found have positively doped through the doping process, he/she will be dealt

with in accordance with the IWUF Anti-Doping Rules.

26. RESPONSIBILITY OF MEMBER FEDERATIONS

The IWUF member federations (NFs) are responsible for their officials, coaches, athletes, doctors, team judges and observers adhering to the IWUF and to all relevant rules established by the IWUF and the LOC. NFs should ensure that their participants hold themselves to the highest standards in all their actions during the event.

26.1 Fundamental Principles

All NFs' members participating in the 5th WTJQC must observe and respect the IWUF constitution, rules, regulations, and representatives. Individuals deemed to have acted against the IWUF, its principles, interests or purpose may be subject to suspension or expulsion from the event and/or cancellation of their accreditation.

26.2 Attitude of Athletes and Coaches

Athletes will compete under the responsibility of their NFs. NFs are fully responsible regarding the general attitude and comportment of their athletes. Coaches should respect the judging panel and all complaints must be conducted in accordance with competition procedures. Athletes and coaches should comply with the IWUF Code of Ethics. Any act against the IWUF judging panel may be subject to suspension or expulsion from the event and/or cancellation of their accreditation and/or competition results.

26.3 Image of Athletes

Each NF is responsible for obtaining the rights for the IWUF to use its athletes' images at the discretion of the IWUF for promotional purposes in all forms.

27. INSURANCE

Each NF is fully and sole responsible for insuring its athletes against injury and third-party risk (public liability) during the period of the 5th WTJQC. IWUF and LOC are not responsible in part or in whole of the said liability.

28. PASSPORT AND VISA REQUIREMENTS

All participants must hold a valid passport and should allow plenty of time for visa application and processing.

To avoid complications during visa application and travel as possible, it is suggested that all participants' passports are valid for at least 6 months following their final day of travel.

Teams that require visa invitation letters should state their requests in the Entry Form **from January 25, 2026**.

International Wushu Federation (IWUF) Brand Control Guidelines for Wushu Competition Uniforms (excerpt)

1. PURPOSE

To ensure sponsor and manufacture rights by establishing a standard for brand placement on uniforms and other clothing items used during IWUF wushu competition.

2. STANDARDS AND GUIDELINES

Uniforms of athletes, coaches and team officials

3. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The manufacturer logo may appear once on each piece of clothing, with an area of up to 20 cm². Note that only the quantity and size of logos appearing on uniforms will be assessed during the competition, and logos will not be reviewed for accuracy or adherence to brand standards.

The manufacturer logo may appear once on each accessory item (paired accessories are considered as two items), with an area of up to 6 cm².

A manufacturer logo may appear once on each shoe or foot item (paired shoes or foot items are considered as two items), with an area of up to 6 cm².

A national/regional Olympic Committee flag, a national/regional wushu federation flag/logo may each appear once where specified, with an area of up to 20 cm² each.

3.1 WUSHU TAOLU COMPETITION UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS

- **Top/Jacket**

- **Front**

No advertisements or logos may appear on the collar.

A flag may appear on the left chest area, with an area of up to 20 cm².

The manufacturer logo may appear on the right chest area, with an area of up to 20 cm².

No advertisements may appear in other areas.

- **Back**

Sponsor or other logos may be displayed in other areas. The total number of sponsor or other logos may not exceed three (3), with a maximum area of 20 cm² each.

● **Pants/Trousers**


○ **Left leg**

The manufacturer logo may be arranged on the top, with an area of up to 10 cm².

Sponsor logos may appear below the manufacturer's logo but may not appear within 5 cm of the manufacturer's logo, with an area of up to 10 cm².

○ **Right leg**

No logo, flag, or other emblem may appear.
